## **RESOLUTION Opposing Kill Switch Mandate in Biden Infrastructure Bill**

Whereas, the Biden Administration's Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) directs the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA) to issue a rule that <u>requires</u> new passenger vehicles to have 'advanced drunk and impaired driving prevention technology' by 2024; and

Whereas, this requirement amounts to a vehicle kill switch mandate as early as 2026 and Section 24220 of the IIJA requires <u>all</u> newly manufactured vehicles to be equipped with technology to passively monitor driver performance and to <u>prevent vehicle operation</u> including using eye movements, real-time breath detection, hands on steering wheel and lane position; and

Whereas, this technology's <u>stated</u> aim is to detect 'impaired' drivers (which is not defined in statute), enabling the federal government to track <u>every</u> American's vehicle (in order to know if a person is suspected of being impaired) whether or not the driver is <u>actually</u> drunk or impaired, this technology will allow surveillance of American citizens without a warrant, destroying our right to privacy, instituting unconstitutional tracking, and other civil rights violations; and

**Whereas,** a kill switch can pose frightening safety concerns cutting off power to a moving vehicle, posing grave risks to both the driver and other cars in order to get a vehicle safely parked on the side of a road, and could cause drivers to be stranded, alone, and vulnerable on the side of the road with a totally disabled vehicle among a host of other dangers,

**Whereas**, 31 states allow for court-mandated ignition interlock devices (IID) to prevent drivers from starting their car without first passing a self-administered breathalyzer test, there is no need for another federal mandate,

Now, therefore, be it:

**Resolved,** that we demand our state and federal lawmakers, with all haste, to prohibit a government-mandated kill switch or other device designed to cease a vehicle's operation remotely; and further be it

**Resolved,** that we demand our officials proceed with urgency to protect Americans' constitutional rights by stopping this federal mandate and prohibiting installation of kill switches into American vehicles.
